

Taman Tugu Project

Enhancing the liveability and connectivity

The Taman Tugu Project ("TTP") is an initiative to conserve and activate a forest park in the heart of Kuala Lumpur as well as to connect the surrounding area. The 66 acre site located behind the National Monument will provide an additional publically accessible green space for the community of Kuala Lumpur ("KL") by 2018. This project complements the 11th Malaysian Plan and Greater KL and Klang Valley initiatives to transform KL into a world-class city by 2020.

The TTP covers the following four components:

- Conserving and activating a 66-acre urban forest park
- Building four connectors
- Khazanah ILMU - a learning and innovation center
- Operations and maintenance, including cleaning, upkeep, security and utilities up to 2030

The TTP was officially launched on 4 September 2016 by YAB Prime Minister.
